SCDOT Project Update

US 29 (Church Street) Bridge Rehab Project

Construction Start: April 15, 2025 Estimated Completion: July 31, 2026



South Carolina Department of Transportation and the City of Greenville have begun work on the US 29 (Church Street) Bridge Rehab Project. The project will rehabilitate the US 29 (Church Street) Bridge to address the deteriorating bridge deck and improve the overall condition of the structure.

The bridge deck, concrete piers, and the bridge drainage system will be repaired and the bridge aesthetics and pedestrian safety

features will be improved. These improvements include embossing Greenville logo in bridge, replacement of existing stairs, new overhead and pedestal lighting, new railings, and a wider sidewalk on the southbound side.

What To Expect During Construction

Construction will be completed in 2 phases: (See ChurchStBridgeRehab.com for detailed staging information.)

Phase I (Stages 1-3): Vehicular traffic on the bridge has been reduced to one lane in each direction. The lane closure locations will vary based on construction work zones. A dedicated alternate route has been signed. **Estimated completion date:** March 4, 2026

Interim Reopening: Beginning March 5, 2026 the bridge will be reopened to four lanes to accommodate increased traffic volumes from planned events.

Phase II (Stage 4): The bridge will be closed and all vehicular traffic will be detoured. **Duration:** 6 weeks (beginning no earlier than May 1, 2026)

The City has worked diligently to re-time surrounding signals to accommodate changes in traffic patterns throughout construction.

SCDOT will work with the contractor to minimize noise impacts to surrounding residents and businesses by limiting night work.

Variable Message Signs have been installed to alert drivers to changes in traffic patterns as lane closure locations will vary throughout construction.
