Welcome

On behalf of South Carolina Department of Transportation and the City of Greenville, welcome to the Project Update Meeting (PIM) for the proposed US 29 (Church Street) Bridge Rehab Project. SCDOT is rehabilitating the US 29 (Church Street) Bridge to address the deteriorating bridge deck and improve the overall condition of the structure.

The bridge deck, concrete piers, and the bridge drainage system will be repaired and the bridge aesthetics and pedestrian safety features will be improved. These improvements include embossing Greenville logo in bridge, replacement of existing stairs, new overhead and pedestal lighting, new railings, and a wider sidewalk on the southbound side.

The purpose of this meeting is to provide you with an opportunity to review and discuss the construction phasing, detour routes, and traffic impacts.

What To Expect During Construction

Construction will be completed in 2 phases:

Phase I: Vehicular traffic on the bridge will be reduced to one lane in each direction. A dedicated alternate route will be signed.
Duration: 11 months

Phase II: The bridge will be closed and vehicular traffic will be detoured. **Duration:** 6 weeks

The City will be working diligently to re-time surrounding signals to accommodate changes in traffic patterns throughout construction.

SCDOT will work with the contractor to minimize noise impacts to surrounding residents and businesses by limiting night work.

During construction we will be placing Variable Message Signs to alert drivers to changes in traffic patterns as lane closure locations will vary throughout construction.



TITLE VI COMPLIANCE

SCDOT complies with all requirements set forth by federal regulations issued by the U.S. Department of Transportation under the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended. Any persons who believe that he or she has been discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, age, handicap or disability, or national origin under a program receiving federal aid has the right to file a complaint with SCDOT. The complaint shall be filed with the Title VI Program Compliance Coordinator, at the Office of Business Development & Special programs, 955 Park Street, Suite 117, Columbia, SC 29202 or at 803.737.5095. The complaint should be submitted no later than 180 days after the date of the alleged act of discrimination. It should outline as completely as possible the facts and circumstances of the incident and should be signed by the person making the complaint.


